Did You Know? – Flax Edition

- Flax seed that is harvested for its commercial oil content (known as linseed oil), is the main ingredient in production of linoleum flooring, and in quality oil-based paints and stains.
- Flax seed is well known for its health benefits as it is high in omega 3 and fibre.
- This was the first oilseed to be widely grown in Western Canada.
- Now, Canada is the world's largest producer and exporter of flax with annual exports valued at \$150-180 million.
- Canada represents about 40% of the world's flax production. Saskatchewan has been the largest producing province since 1993-1994. Just over 1 of every 4 farms in Saskatchewan include flax in their rotation.
- China, US and India together account for 4% of world production. Within the EU, the main producers of flax seed are Germany, UK and France.

How Long Do Seeds Last?

Replace after	Type of Seed
1 Year	Lettuce, onions, parsley, parsnips, salsify
2 Years	Corn, leeks, okra, peppers
3 Years	Asparagus, beans, broccoli, carrots, celery, kohlrabi, peas, spinach
4 Years	Beets, brussel sprouts, cabbages, cauliflower, Swiss chard, eggplants, kale, pumpkins, radishes, rutabagas, squahes, tomatoes, turnips, watermelons
5 Years	Cucumbers, endive, cantaloupes

How to Tell if your Seeds are Still Good ...

Place ten seeds on a damp paper towel, fold it up and place it in a plastic bag. Store the bag in a warm spot for about a week, then check how many seeds have sprouted.

- If 2 out of 10 seeds germinated, that leaves you with a germination rate of 20%, which isn't great. Either plant more than usual or buy new seeds.
- If 8 out of 10 germinated, that is 80% germination which isn't bad and you will likely get away with using them another year.

RUSTY GRAIN BEETLES

The most common and serious insect pest of grain is the Rusty Grain Beetle. Large populations can cause the grain to heat and spoil. Look for a distinct emergence hole in the germ area of the seed. Rusty Grain Beetle can affect wheat, barley, rye, triticale, oats and heated flax. Warm, moist, or weedy crops are most susceptible to damage.

The best way to prevent a Rusty Grain Beetle infestation is to thoroughly clean the bin prior to filling. If there is a history of infestation in a bin, it can be sprayed or dusted with a recommended insecticide before grain storage.

If a grain beetle problem is determined, a producer can move grain in cold weather (-20°C or colder). Moving the grain cools and dries the grain and insects, reducing populations and dispersing any warm or moist grain pockets. Fumigation with Phostoxin is also possible at this stage.

CROCKPOT ROOT BEER BARBECUE

CHICKEN

Ingredients:

- 3 pounds boneless chicken breasts, fresh or thawed
- 18 ounces Sweet Baby Ray's Honey BB! Sauce (1 bottle)
- 6 ounces Root Beer (1/2 of a 12 ounce can)

Instructions:

- 1. Cook chicken in crockpot on HIGH for 3 hours or LOW for 6 hours (covered).

- 4. Pour mixture over chicken, and cook on high for 30 more minutes (covered).

Key Facts for Beef Producers

Drought Management: A Long-Term Grazing Plan

Strategies for dealing with drought should be a permanent part of every grazing plan. You can't plan for a drought once you are in the middle of it.





Leave litter (plant residue) to shade and insulate the soil surface, reduce temperatures and minimize moisture loss.



Keep a rested

pasture with

adequate carryover

in your grazing

rotation to provide

a forage reserve.

higher grazing-tolerant

(e.g. crested wheatgrass)

plant species first.

Balance stocking rate with forage supply. (e.g. weaning early, identifying and selling culls early)



Extend rest periods for pastures by using cross-fencing and rotational grazing.



Stockpile sufficient feed supplies during years of surplus.
